HOUSE BILL NO. 1411

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 69-1-351, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 2 TO EXTEND THE DATE OF REPEAL ON THE PROVISION OF LAW THAT ESTABLISHES AND PRESCRIBES THE POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE 3 INTERAGENCY FARM TO SCHOOL COUNCIL; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. Section 69-1-351, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 7 amended as follows: 69-1-351. (1) There is created an Interagency Farm to 8 9 School Council, to identify models and methods of promoting farm 10 to school programs in the state in order to improve the availability of healthy, fresh foods in schools and to promote the 11 12 economic development of Mississippi farmers and food producers. The council shall be composed of the following members: 13 (2) 14 (a) One (1) person who represents the State Department of Education, appointed by the State Superintendent of Public 15 Education: 16

(b) One (1) person who represents the Mississippi

- 22 (d) One (1) person who represents the Mississippi State
- 23 University Extension Program;
- (e) One (1) person who represents the Alcorn State
- 25 University Extension Program;
- 26 (f) One (1) person who represents food service
- 27 directors in Mississippi public schools, appointed by the State
- 28 Superintendent of Public Education;
- 29 (g) One (1) person who represents a nonprofit
- 30 organization in Mississippi working to promote farm to school
- 31 programs, appointed by the Commissioner of Agriculture and
- 32 Commerce;
- 33 (h) One (1) person who represents poultry producers in
- 34 Mississippi, appointed by the President of the Mississippi Poultry
- 35 Association;
- 36 (i) One (1) person who represents the Mississippi Farm
- 37 Bureau Federation.
- 38 (3) In appointing members of the council, the appointing
- 39 authority shall ensure that the members reflect the diversity of
- 40 this state, with members representing rural areas, urban areas and
- 41 different geographical regions of the state.
- 42 (4) The council is charged with facilitating the creation
- 43 and growth of farm to school programs in communities throughout
- 44 the State of Mississippi through studying, recommending and

- 45 administering best practices for creating farm to school programs.
- 46 This can be accomplished with actions including, but not limited
- 47 to:
- 48 (a) Creating and administering an assessment or survey
- 49 designed to evaluate what specific programs or efforts would be
- 50 the most effective in increasing the number of farm to school
- 51 programs in the State of Mississippi;
- 52 (b) Helping to develop and expand local pilot farm to
- 53 school programs in Mississippi;
- 54 (c) Notifying and assisting interested schools, farms,
- 55 and community organizations in applying for funding sources and
- 56 grants related to supporting and decreasing the cost of purchasing
- 57 locally grown and locally raised agricultural products to serve in
- 58 school meals;
- 59 (d) Assisting Mississippi farmers in marketing and
- 60 building commercial relationships with food service directors in
- 61 schools;
- 62 (e) Developing or administering training programs for
- 63 Mississippi farmers related to marketing crops, food safety,
- 64 processing crops, business management, liability and risk
- 65 management, and any other topics deemed appropriate by the
- 66 council;
- 67 (f) Working with the Mississippi Department of
- 68 Education Office of Child Nutrition to assist school food service
- 69 directors in creating and amending school procedures, procurement

- 70 forms, proper handling, preparing and storing procedures in order
- 71 to facilitate the purchase of locally grown and locally raised
- 72 agricultural products to be served in school meals;
- 73 (g) Developing or assisting an organization in
- 74 developing a website that lists schools and farmers interested in
- 75 participating in farm to school programs, promotes farm to school
- 76 events and programs throughout the state and promotes
- 77 communication and sales between Mississippi farmers and schools;
- 78 and
- 79 (h) Encouraging schools, community organizations,
- 80 restaurants, grocery retail stores and other local organizations
- 81 and businesses to purchase more locally grown and locally raised
- 82 agricultural products to serve or sell through their businesses in
- 83 order to support and increase local farmers' capacity to grow and
- 84 produce food for commercial purposes.
- 85 (5) The council should hold its first meeting no later than
- 86 August 1, 2013, with the date, time and location of this first
- 87 meeting to be determined jointly by the members serving on the
- 88 council. At the first meeting, the council shall elect a
- 89 chairman, vice chairman, and any other officers deemed necessary,
- 90 from its members. The council shall meet periodically but no less
- 91 than four (4) times per year.
- 92 (6) Members of the council shall serve without compensation
- 93 or reimbursement for their expenses related to participating in
- 94 the council, and the council shall function without appropriations

- 95 or state funds. However, the council can accept funds that may be
- 96 offered as financial grants from public or private sources. The
- 97 Mississippi State Legislature and any department, division, board,
- 98 bureau, commission or agency of the state, or of any political
- 99 subdivision thereof, may provide, at the request of the chair of
- 100 the council, such facilities, assistance and data as will enable
- 101 the council to carry out its duties.
- 102 (7) The council shall report its progress and findings to
- 103 the Education Committees of the House of Representatives and the
- 104 Senate, the Agriculture Committees of the House of Representatives
- 105 and the Senate, the Public Health and Human Services Committee of
- 106 the House of Representatives, the Public Health and Welfare
- 107 Committee of the Senate, or any successor committees, on or before
- 108 January 1, 2015, and once annually in each following year in which
- 109 the council is convened.
- 110 (8) The provisions of this section shall stand repealed from
- 111 and after July 1, * * 2018.
- 112 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 113 and after July 1, 2015.
